SPECIAL PRIZE: RHS BANKSIAN MEDAL

This medal will be awarded to the competitor who obtains the largest total amount of money in prizes (excluding special prizes) in the Horticultural Classes (Sections A, B, C and Palmer Collection). Any competitor who has won the Banksian Medal in the last two years is not eligible to win the medal this year.

SHOW RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

The Show will be conducted in accordance with the rules and standards contained in the Royal Horticultural Society's HORTICULTURAL SHOW HANDBOOK, except where, under the schedule, they obviously do not apply.

1. Exceptionally for 2021 there will be no fees for entry to classes and all classes are OPEN i.e. there are no local or novice classes.

2. An exhibitor's card must be placed face downwards with each exhibit after staging and not removed from the exhibit. Every care will be taken of the exhibits, but the Committee will not be held responsible for loss or damage.

3. An exhibitor may make two entries in one class. Points awarded to both entries will count towards the section cup. Except in classes, A, B and C only the highest money prize of the two entries will be paid. Two people may exhibit produce from the same garden in any class but they may only make one entry each in such class. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entry.

4. In Sections A, B, and C more than one money prize may be won in a class – all prize money will count towards the total for the Banksian Medal.

5. The marquee will be open for staging at 8.00 a.m. on the day of the Show and staging must be completed by 10.45 am. Exhibits must not be removed before 4.30 pm (and not later than 5pm). Any entries in the Marquee after 5pm may be sold unless specified on the exhibit card NOT FOR AUCTION.

6. Collections of vegetables are to be staged on a space of 2'6 x 2'6.

7a. All exhibits must be grown in the exhibitor's garden or allotment up to & including Section C. All other exhibits must be the work of the exhibitor & not previously shown in the Society's Shows.

7b. Class F3—Dressmakers dummies may be used to display items, as long as the item is within size allowed – 2' x 2'.

8. The Committee reserves the right to inspect any exhibitor's garden or allotment.

9. Exhibitors in the Vegetable and Domestic Produce Sections must provide their own display vessels unless otherwise specified.

10. Judging will begin at 11 a.m. sharp! The decision of the judges shall be final.

11. The judges may withhold prizes where they consider that the entries do not merit awards.

12. No person other than those appointed by the Committee may be in the Marquee during judging.

13. Points will be awarded as follows: 1st – 3 points; 2nd – 2 points; 3rd – 1 point except for collections of vegetables, where points will be 1st – 6 points; 2nd – 4 points; and 3rd – 2 points.

14. All Challenge Cups are perpetual and cannot be won outright, but must be competed for each year. The holders are responsible for the safe keeping of the cups and must return them in good order not later than the last week of July.

15. An announcement during the afternoon will be made regarding distribution of prizes.

16. Notice of objections to any exhibitor or exhibit must be made in writing and handed to the Show Secretary not later than 3 pm on the day of the Show. It must be accompanied by a deposit of £5.00 which will be repaid if the objection is upheld.

17. In classes where vases are not provided, a "vase" means any container of which the height is greater than the diameter at the top; a "bowl" is one of which the diameter at the top is not less than the height.

18. The Committee reserves the right to settle any dispute in such a manner as it may decide and such decisions shall be final.

In order to increase the interest of the Show, exhibitors are requested to attach to their entries, where possible, a label with the name of the variety being exhibited.

NOTE: The collection must include at least one vase of flowers and one dish of vegetables. Number in vase or dish is optional e.g. 3 beetroot, 3 dahlias, 6 potatoes, 2 cucumber or aubergines, 5 asters, 5 zinnias, 5 apples. Space per exhibit 2' 6" x 2' 6" (75 x 75cm).

ALLOTMENT COLLECTION *(Open to Cholsey Allotment holders only)*

🏆 President's Challenge Cup, donated by Mr C. Boshier, awarded to the winner of the Allotment Collection

A display of least 5 kinds of vegetable, maximum of 3 per kind.

NOTE: This will be judged on the general quality of the vegetables and the overall appearance of the display. Exhibits should be grown primarily for eating.

- C1 1 vase of 3 blooms – Medium Decorative – one variety or mixed
- C2 1 vase of 3 blooms – Small or Miniature Decorative – one variety or mixed
- C3 1 vase of 3 blooms – Miniature or Small Cactus and/or Semi Cactus – one variety or mixed
- C4 1 vase of 3 blooms – Medium Cactus and/or Semi Cactus – one variety or mixed
- C5 1 vase of 3 blooms – any other Dahlia – one variety or mixed
- C6 1 Specimen bloom

Judging will be to the rules of the NDS; vases will be supplied.

SECTION D ~ FLORAL DECORATIVE

🏆 Challenge Cup, awarded for most points in the Floral Decorative section

- D1 Contemporary Design – Hand tied bunch to include flowers and foliage to be presented in a vase or container. Space allowed 18” x 18”.
- D2 Teatime” – A floral design in a teapot to include flowers and foliage but NO oasis. Space allowed 12” x 12”.
- D3 “Rainbow – A front facing design using flowers from the colours of the rainbow with foliage. Space allowed 18” x 18”.
- D4 “World of Fantasy” – A design of flowers and foliage which may include accessories. Space allowed 18” x 18”.

SECTION E ~ DOMESTIC PRODUCE
